



WEA Annual Scholarship

Since 2014, the Winnipeg Executive Association (WEA) has provided 2 x \$1,000 scholarships annually. One scholarship is available to a post-secondary student from a Habitat homeowner family (biological, adopted, or permanent fostering) under the age of 25, determined by calendar year. Another will be awarded to a student from a WEA member's family (biological, adopted, or permanent fostering). In any year where there is not a suitable applicant from the WEA, then a second scholarship will be awarded to a Habitat student.

Applications must be submitted by May 31, 2018 and will be reviewed by Habitat for Humanity and WEA representatives. Awards will be presented at the end of June 2018.

Main Criteria for scholarship award:

- Enrolled in a post-secondary institution with full time or close to full time status, including apprenticeship programs
- Canadian citizen or a permanent resident of Canada

Additional consideration will be given to:

- After school volunteering, extra-curricular activities or work

Once proof of enrollment and a final report card are submitted, the funds can be released.



Habitat for Humanity and the Winnipeg Executive Association (WEA) have partnered to award one \$1000.00 scholarship annually, available to children of Habitat homeowners (biological, adopted, or permanent fostering) who are planning to attend or are already attending college, university or apprenticeship programs.
